Generation management

The ageing of the population is a great challenge for both society, businesses and individuals. A large proportion of the baby boom generation will have retired in many countries by no later than 2013, and, at the same time, demands to lengthen work careers by 1–3 years are becoming stronger and stronger. What should be done? How should older and experienced workers and employees be motivated to continue to work after the age of 63? What factors could motivate businesses to keep experienced and competent older workers when economic fluctuations create opposite needs for work organizations? These are difficult questions, but sustainable solutions are available. Good management and leadership that takes the strengths of each generation into account is in a key position in this respect – we call such competence **age management** or **generation management**.

About the trainer

Prof. Dr. Juhani Ilmarinen was responsible for research about new concepts for work and retirement for more than 20 years at the *Finnish Institute of Occupational Health (FIOH)*. He has more than 500 publications on occupational health, work physiology, work ability and ageing. He has published 8 books including a handbook on age management called 'Towards a Longer Work Life' (2006) and 'Age power at work' (2012). In cooperation with FIOH advisors he lectured and coached Finnish managers about age management and the concept of work ability. After retirement from the FIOH in the beginning of 2009, after 35 years of service, Professor Juhani Ilmarinen established JIC Ltd which on-going mission is to implement an evidence-based model for work ability and to promote the status of all generations with respect to the concepts of age management, work ability and the life course.

In recent years Juhani Ilmarinen has become a much requested speaker on sustainable employability.



Main purpose of the training

This 2,5 day programme focuses on generation and age management on the level of society, organizations and individuals. During the training you learn about the age management concept, the eight visions of age management and practical tools for supervisors and how they can be implemented in organizations. Besides that you learn more about work ability, the use of the work ability house and the Work Ability Index and new methods for Work Well Being.
